Who is attending college?

53% of predominantly minority rural students (urban schools have similar numbers)



72% of high income predominantly non-minority suburban students

Only 42% of people in the USA that at 18-24 enroll 69% of students on average

What jobs require what education?

- → According to the Bureau of Labor statistics,
 - ◆ 39% of jobs require just a high school diploma
 - ◆ 27% require less than a high school diploma
 - ◆ 18% require a bachelor

Online vs. Face-to-Face

★ Online

- Self-motivation
- o Can work full time or more
- Check for 100% online
- o Required access to a computer and Internet



Online vs. Face-to-Face

★ Face-to-Face

- Work schedule and/or class schedule dependent on each other
- Required to have access to a computer + Internet in some courses, but quick access to campus library/computers
- Socialization (fraternities, sororities, clubs and more)
- Housing costs

Funding (Grants, Scholarships and Loans)

★ Subsidized Loan vs. Unsubsidized Loan

- o Subsidized = fixed interest, low fees
- Ounsubsidized = non-fixed interest, more
 expensive in long run

★ Grants and Scholarships = Free Money

- Apply through school and with FAFSA
- o Some grants will be offered with loans

Gap Year: Take Time Off to Find Yourself

Local Employment Options (Require No School)

A to Z Drain Service: benefits, opportunities to advance, paid training

Aldi: starts at \$13.10 an hour, plus pay increase after a year

Alorica (call center): great for early customer service work, opportunities to advance

Apprenticeships: OhioMeansJobs

Being an Influencer: High Risk, Low Reward

- ★ Bring in small income during free time
- ★ Incredibly difficult to break through
- ★ Investments are needed upfront
 - Camera and sound equipment
 - o Lighting
 - High quality computer

- ★ Twitch streamers that have met the requirements for affiliate make:
 - 50% of subscription money
 - ■Ad money
 - Flat donation money
- ★ YouTube creators making original copyright free content make money with:
 - Advertisements
 - Sponsorships

Military:

G.I. Bill

Those in the military or who have retired or were honorably discharged who served at least **two years** can receive scholarships from the military to pay for all education expenses, including books, housing and more!
